## Sample COVID-19 Protocols for F2F Events

**As we all begin to return to a more normal way of operating in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Parr Center is excited to announce that the 2022 North Carolina Ethics Bowl will be conducted in-person, on the campus of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, on January 29, 2022. As ever, our highest priority remains the health and safety of our participants and their communities.**

The fundamental objective of the [National High School Ethics Bowl](#) involves equipping students with the tools to become more ethically reflective and engaged members of their moral and civic communities. As such, it is our expectation that NCHSEB participants show proper regard for the safety of their fellow participants by complying with all safety regulations detailed here. The Parr Center has consulted widely with the relevant officials, and developed the following set of protocols to ensure the health and safety of our participants while on the UNC campus. These policies are subject to change (with proper notification to participants) in the event of any unforeseen emergency.

***If any attendee is unwilling or unable to comply with these policies as detailed here, or with instructions from NCHSEB event staff, they may be asked to leave campus. Participant violations of this policy may result in competitive disqualification.***

### VACCINATIONS AND TESTING

All participants (students, coaches/chaperones, and volunteers) will be asked to provide either proof of an FDA-authorized COVID-19 vaccination or proof of a negative COVID-19 test administered within 72 hours of the beginning of the event (9AM on 1/29/22). This documentation can be submitted securely online in advance of check-in for participants, and should be presented at the time of check-in for any guests or spectators. Any documentation submitted for the purposes of compliance with this policy will be kept confidential, used only for the purposes of verifying compliance, and destroyed after the conclusion of the event. It will not be retained by the Parr Center for Ethics or UNC-CH.

COVID-19 vaccinations are freely and widely available to everyone age 5 and older in North Carolina. For more information about safe and effective COVID-19 vaccinations, or to schedule an appointment at a location near you, please visit [yourspotyourshot.nc.gov](https://yourspotyourshot.nc.gov). COVID-19 testing is available throughout North Carolina including at many clinics and pharmacies, as well as a [drive-thru testing site](#) near UNC's Chapel Hill Campus. The North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services maintains a [searchable listing](#) of vaccination sites. There are also [no-cost community testing events](#) across the state. Finally, participants may also [request a free at-home test kit](#) from LabCorp.

### FACE COVERINGS

Per UNC policy and CDC recommendations, all participants, staff, and attendees at the 2022 North Carolina High School Ethics Bowl will be required to wear a mask or cloth face covering at all times while indoors on the UNC campus, including during matches. The lone exception to this policy is among participants during meals, which will employ all relevant safety protocols otherwise.
